PUBLIC COMMENTS

ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION PLAN

A resident, Stephanie Townsend, from Locke Drive, addressed the Board, inquiring as to the status of the Active Transportation Plan and wondering if the Town is still accepting comments. The Supervisor indicated that the committee is near the end of their work in drafting a plan, however, comments and suggestions are welcome at any time and can be emailed or sent to the Supervisor directly. He expects that the final draft will be completed within the next day or two for the committee's final review and revisions. This draft will be posted on the Town's website once it has been received from the consultant assisting with this initiative. The resident wondered if the final document will include strategies for funding of the specific recommendations of the plan. The Supervisor explained that the plan will not include strategies for funding, as priorities within the plan, as they surface, will most likely dictate funding for individual initiatives within the plan.

SPIEGEL COMMUNITY CENTER

Resident, Kendra Evans, addressed the Board, wondering if plans being created for the renovations of the Spiegel Center will include larger meeting rooms for public use. She expressed concern that currently only the Fisher Meeting Room is large enough to accommodate her community meeting and that it is very difficult to find availability when trying to reserve this room. Town Board point person for the Spiegel Community Center Renovation, Mary Doyle, responded to the resident, indicating that the plans are being drafted, with intent to examine a way to better accommodate larger groups, such as described. Councilwoman Doyle indicated that the Town Board encourages and welcomes comments to be emailed to any Town Board member, who will forward them on to her for use in the planning process. She also indicated that the Town's Parks and Recreation Advisory Board are closely involved in the review and planning process. They typically meet on the 2nd Thursday of each month in the Spiegel Community Center at 6:30 p.m. and these meetings are open to the public, should anyone wish to attend.
